

When is it difficult?



1. If their success seems to come at my expense
 - “My work ought to be recognized”



When is it difficult?

2. Jealousy

- “Saul has slain his thousands, And David his ten thousands.” Then Saul was very angry, and the saying displeased him; and he said, “They have ascribed to David ten thousands, and to me they have ascribed only thousands. Now what more can he have but the kingdom?” So Saul eyed David from that day forward.
(1 Sam. 18:7-9)

When is it difficult?

3. Envy

- Def: painful or resentful awareness of an advantage enjoyed by another joined with a desire to possess the same advantage.
- EX: Rachel and Leah
- Now when Rachel saw that she bore Jacob no children, Rachel envied her sister, and said to Jacob, “Give me children, or else I die!” (Gen. 30:1)



When is it difficult?

4. When another person's joy reminds me of my deficiency



How to rejoice with others?

1. Do not compare

- For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith. For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them..." (Rom. 12:3-6)
