 - EX: Pharisees




Why do we lie?

- 3. Greed
 - EX: Ananias and Sapphira
- 4. Ambition for position or influence
- 5. To cover a sin



Why do we lie?

- 6. Establish control over a situation.
 - EX: Rebekah dresses Jacob in goat skin
- 7. Maintain privacy
- 8. Avoid embarrassment



Overcoming the sin of Lying

- 1. Be precise with your words
- 2. Purify your inner self
 - "Blind Pharisee, first cleanse the inside of the cup and dish, that the outside of them may be clean also." (Matt. 23:26)
 - "...for I will speak the truth. But I refrain, lest anyone should think of me above what he sees me to be or hears from me." (1 Cor. 12:6)



Overcoming the sin of Lying

3. Confess the lie

• "...have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather expose them." (Eph. 5:11)

4. Lying increases stress

• "The character of the soul is its commitment. By the choices we make and the values we embrace, we shape our own destiny. Truth is the soul's sustenance; falsehood, its poison. Let truth be your guiding principle, for lying disrupts the harmony of the soul." Tertullian (c. 155-240)
