- The disabled




Signs

- 2. Feeling Superior

- 4. Exploitation

How can I reflect God's value in all my relationships?

- Fear the Lord
 - "Blessed is every one who fears the Lord."
- Desire to please and serve Christ and not people
 - "For do I now persuade men, or God? Or do I seek to please men? For if I still pleased men, I would not be a bondservant of Christ." (Gal. 1:10)
 - "Afterward I went into the regions of Syria and Cilicia. 22 And I was unknown by face to the churches of Judea which were in Christ. 23 But they were hearing only, "He who formerly persecuted us now preaches the faith which he once tried to destroy." 24 And they glorified God in me." (Gal. 1:21-24)
