
Why should we honor our parents?

1. Divine command

- "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long upon the land which the LORD your God is giving you." (Exo. 20:12)
- "Every one of you shall revere his mother and his father, and keep My Sabbaths: I am the LORD your God." (Lev. 19:3)
- "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right." (Eph. 6:1)

Dishonoring them

- 2. Gratitude
- 3. Teaches them to respect authority
- Not respecting authority has many negative outcomes:
 - Produces a rebellious heart
 - Hinders your growth
 - Breakdown of order
 - Ultimately, rebelling against God



Dishonoring them

 "Let every soul be subject to the governing" authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God. 2 Therefore whoever resists the authority resists the ordinance of God, and those who resist will bring judgment on themselves. 3 For rulers are not a terror to good works, but to evil. Do you want to be unafraid of the authority? Do what is good, and you will have praise from the same." (Rom. 13:1-4)

4. Teaches the art of unity




Dishonoring them

- How do we honor our parents?
 - Obedience
 - Respect
 - Listen to their wisdom/advise (for adult children)
 - Serve them
 - Reconcile with them
 - Live a godly life
- "Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise: "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth." (Eph. 6:2-3)

Conflict of values

- When my behavior is not in line with the values of my parents
- EX: The Lost Son
- What is the result?
 Who suffers?



Greed

EX: Achan the son of Carmi
The desire to be king has caused many princes to conspire against their father and mother.
EX: Absalom

"In this manner Absalom acted toward all Israel who came to the king for judgment. So Absalom stole the hearts of the men of Israel." (2 Sam. 15:6)

Heeding Rebellious Counsel

- EX: The advice of Ahithophel to Absalom
- "Blessed is the man Who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, Nor stands in the path of sinners, Nor sits in the seat of the scornful..." (Ps. 1:1)
- Do not be deceived: "Evil company corrupts good habits." (1 Cor. 15:33)
- "Leave the presence of a fool, for there you do not meet words of knowledge." (Prov. 14:7 RSV)

Entitlement

- Entitlement is the belief that I am owed unearned privileges and am exempt from responsibility
- EX: The Lost Son
- EX: Eliab, David's older brother
- Now Eliab his oldest brother heard when he spoke to the men; and Eliab's anger was aroused against David, and he said, "Why did you come down here? And with whom have you left those few sheep in the wilderness? I know your pride and the insolence of your heart, for you have come down to see the battle." (1 Sam. 17:28)
