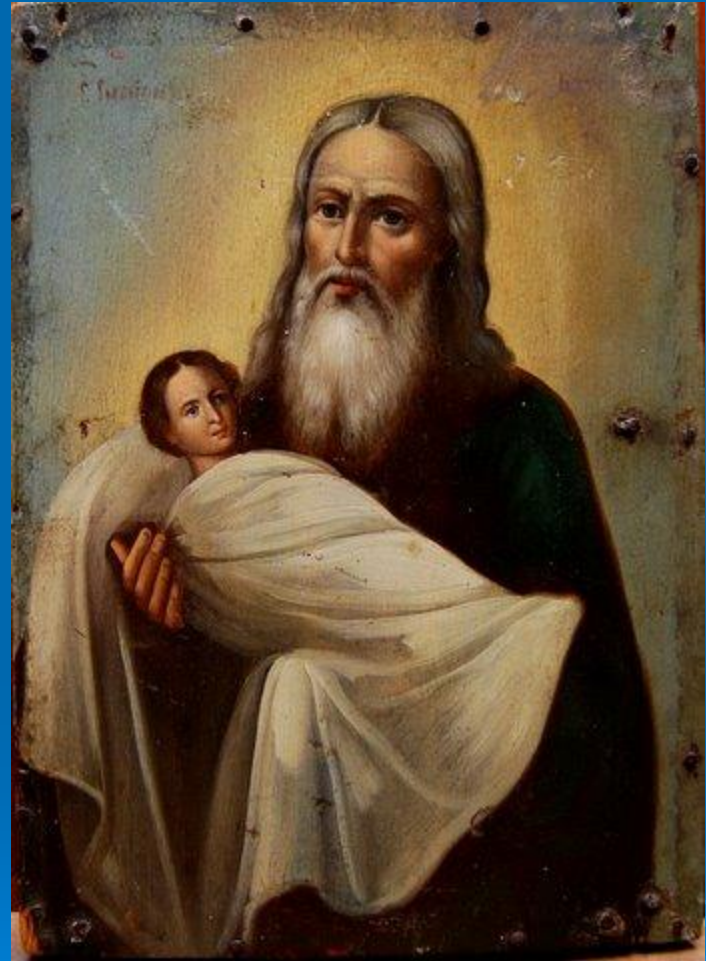

Different leads...one destination ⁽¹⁾

- St. Simeon the elder was led by the Spirit of God.
- This is the leader of those who belong to God: “For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God”

Different leads...one destination ⁽²⁾

- St. Mary was led by her obedience to God's precepts
- St. Joseph the carpenter was led by his care for St. Mary and her child
- Anna the prophetess was led by her devotion to worship



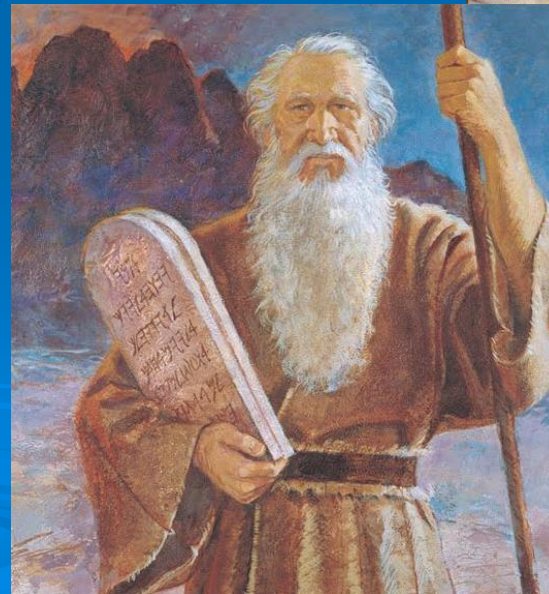
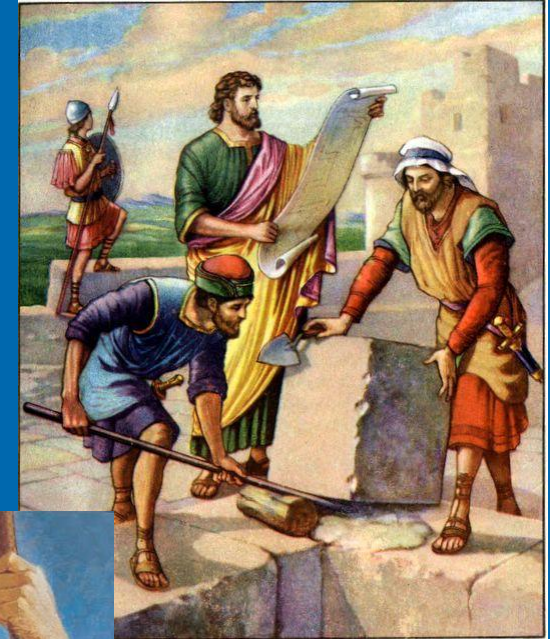
Other noble causes...same good end ⁽¹⁾

- St. Paul was led by his gratitude towards the Son of God
“...and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me” *Galatians 2:20*



Other noble causes...same good end (2)

- Some move with a sense of responsibility towards a stewardship like Nehemiah
- Moses was driven by his love for God's people



Other noble causes...same good end ⁽³⁾

- David's love for God moved him to ask others to taste and see how good God is: "Oh, taste and see that the LORD is good; Blessed is the man who trusts in Him!" *Psalm 34:8*



Things to remember about what leads us ⁽¹⁾

1. What leads me defines where I end
2. Noble causes lead only free and selfless men
3. If I am not led by something, then I will be led by everything



Things to remember about what leads us ⁽²⁾

4. A noble cause has a noble path—no exceptions.
5. It is this driving force that keeps us going in the difficult days.
6. My driving force determines if I travel seeing clearly or blindly.
