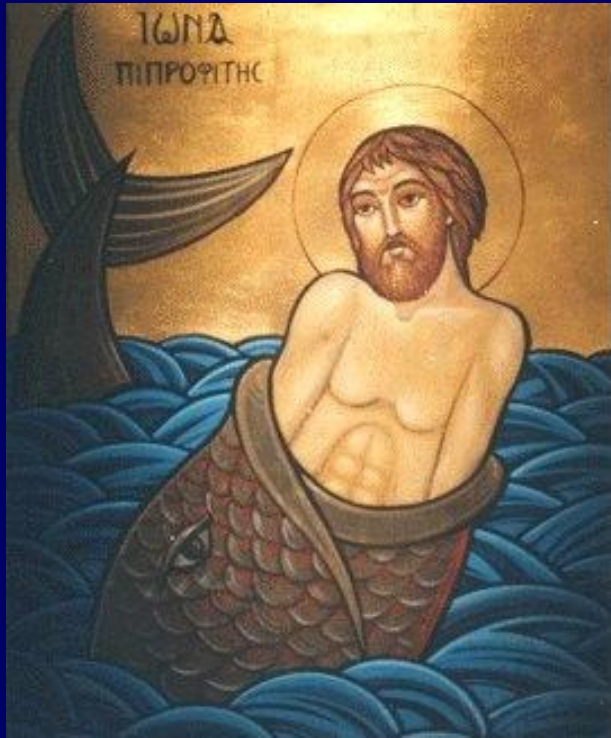
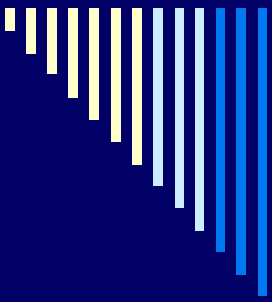
Lessons from the Book of Jonah

2. Jonah, on the other hand, pitied his people, himself and the vine

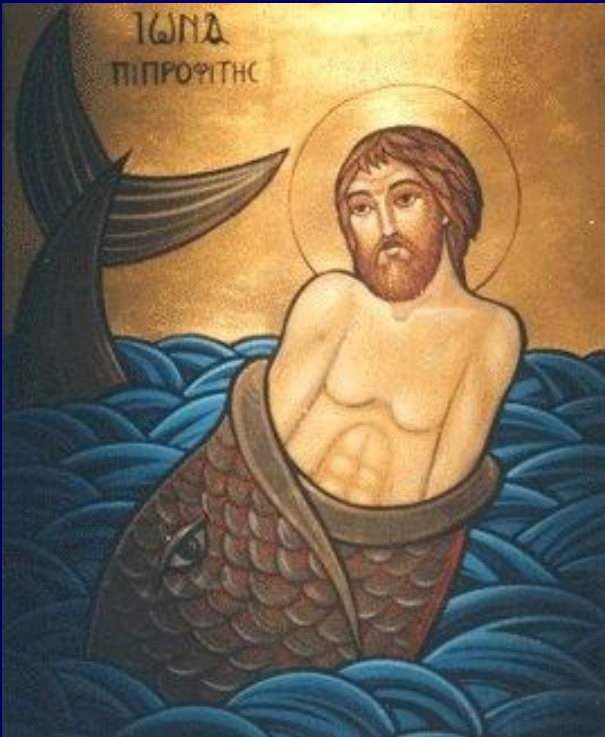
