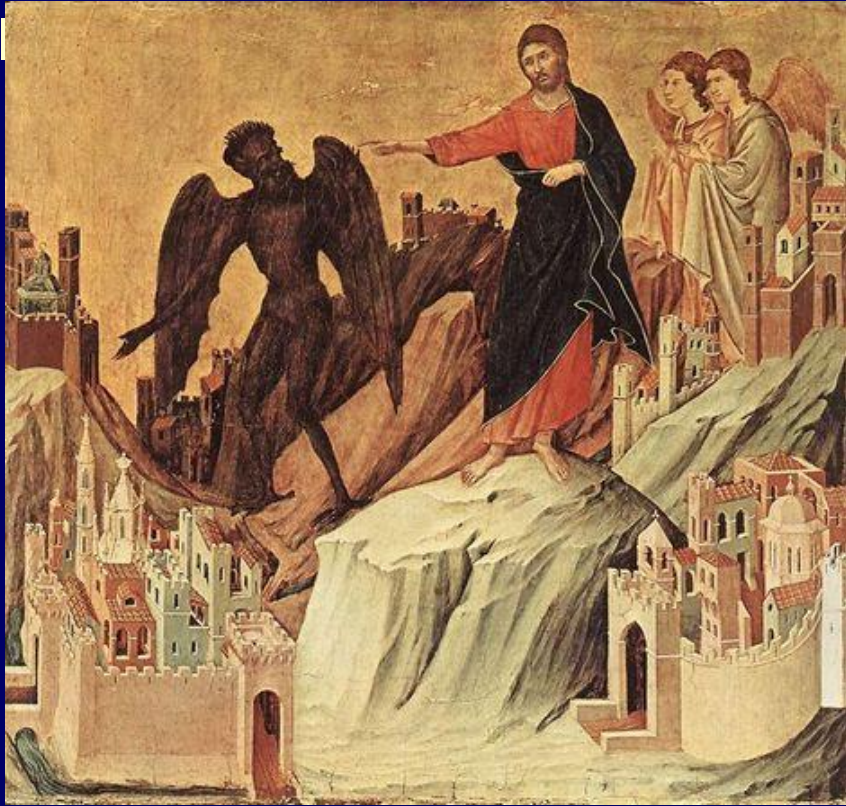
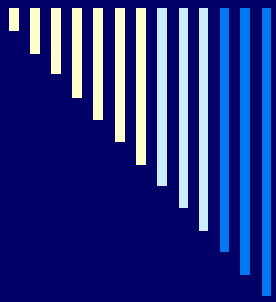

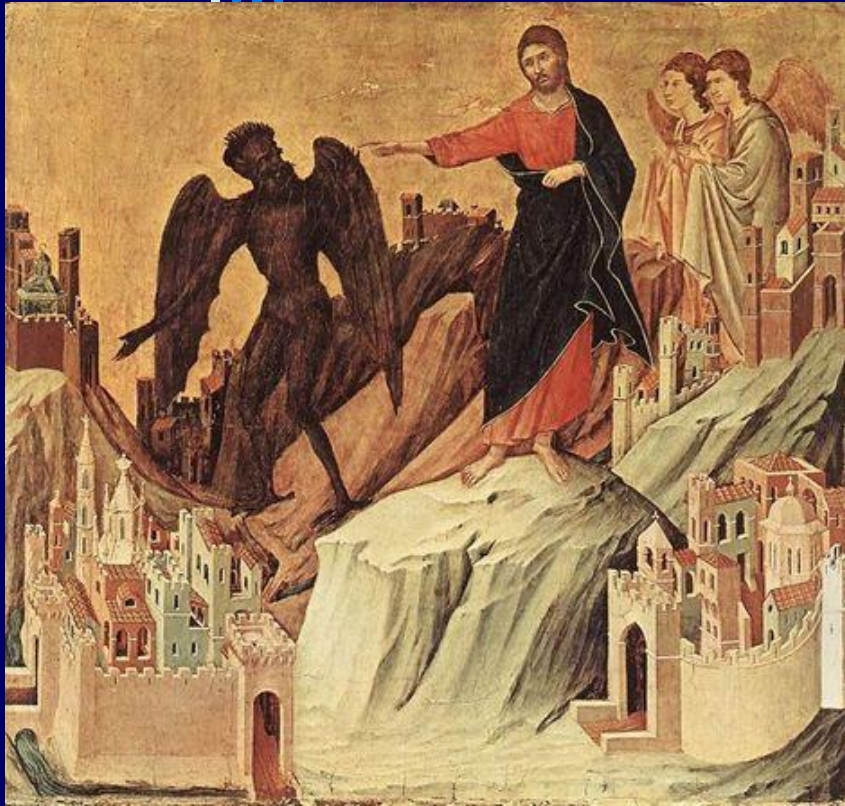

1. Friendship and even what might appear to be good advice from Satan should not be accepted

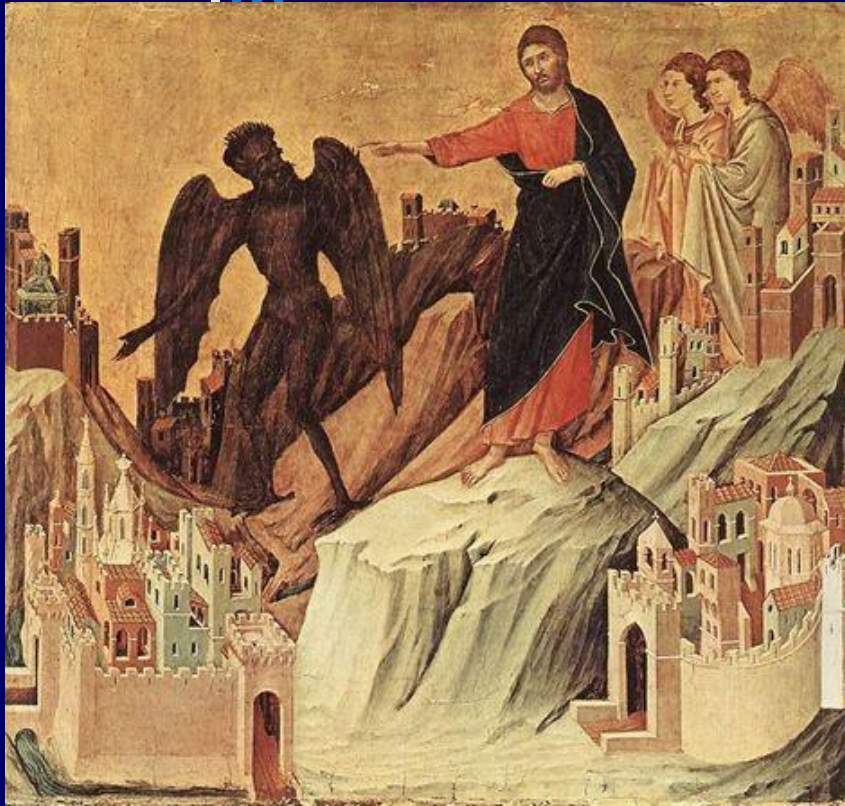

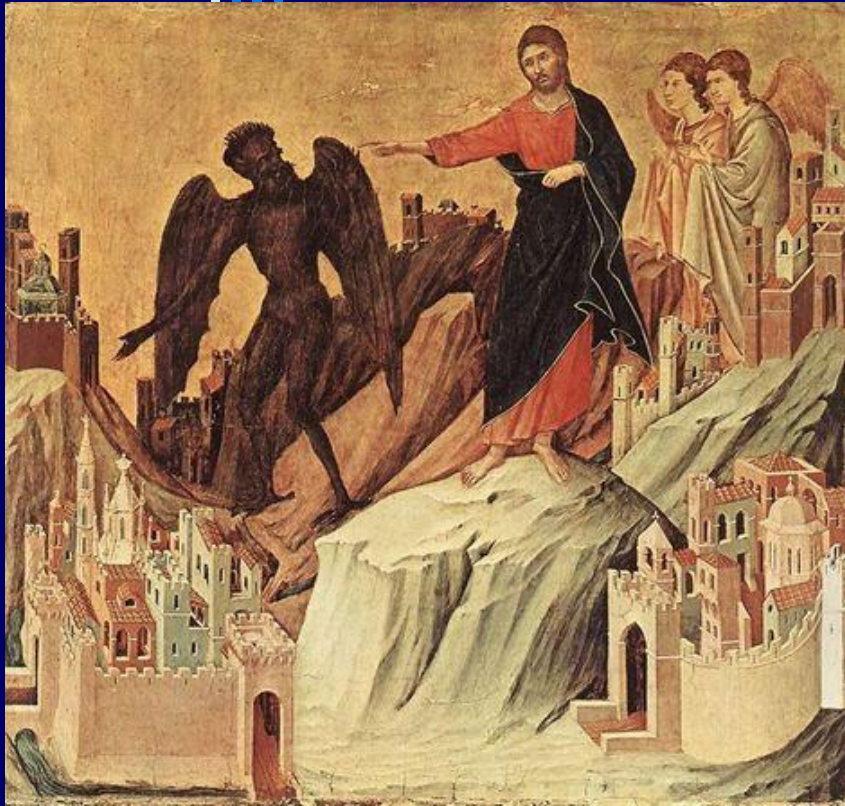


2. The argument should not go further. It should be answered with the Word of God.

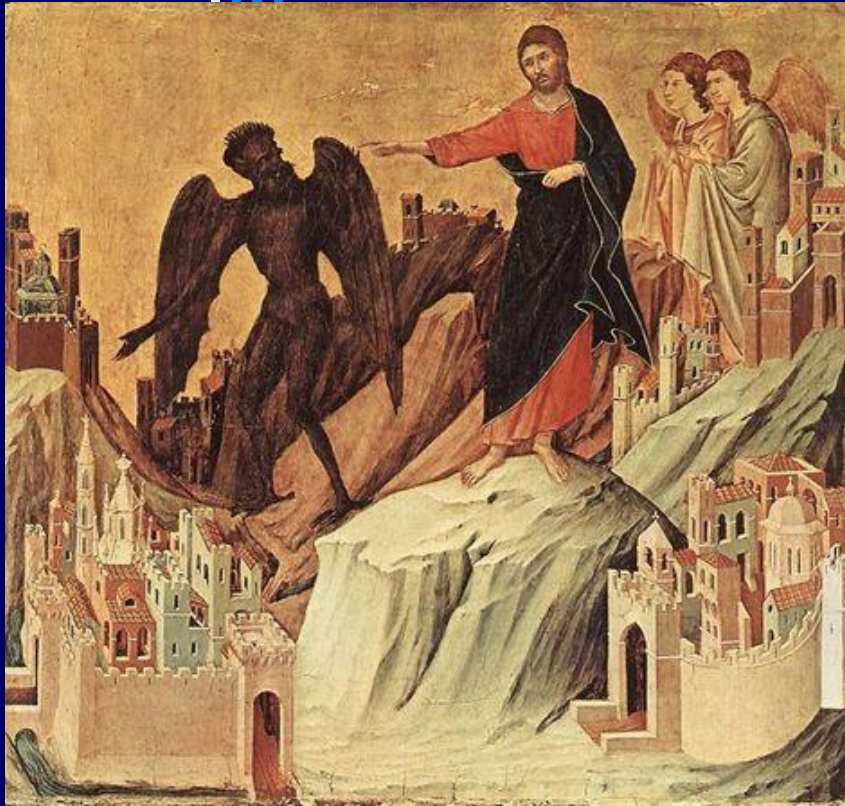

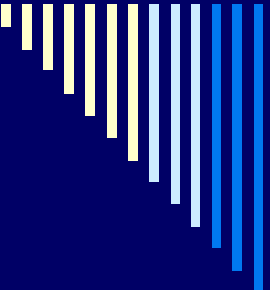
