


How different was this Father?



#### 1. Different in his discernment

- 2. He knew when not to seek after a son and when to go after another one.




#### 2. Different in his love

#### 3. Different in his humility (1)

2. He spared his younger son the usual prideful reproach: "I told you"!!



# 5. Different than others in the story


- The son's friends


How does the image of God become distorted in our minds?
