Preliminary thoughts about evil

 Evil is the absence or privation of something good.

 "It [evil] is not an actual entity but a real corruption in an actual entity."
 (Norman Geisler)

How can such evil exist in A world created by god?

- Two types of evil:
 - Moral
 - Natural
- Three important concepts:
 - God's power
 - God's goodness
 - Presence of evil in the world



• "Is he willing to prevent evil, but not able? Then he is impotent. Is he able, but not willing? Then he is malevolent. Is he able and willing: whence then is evil?" (David Hume)

Philosophical consideration

- What are the criteria for determining what is evil or good?
- We need an infinite reference point that is absolutely good
- "...let God be true but every man a liar." (Rom. 3:4)
- "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work." (2 Tim. 3:16-17)

Origin of evil

- God created everything good
 - "Then God saw everything that He had made, and indeed it was very good." (Gen. 1:31)
- Evil entered the world when mankind freely chose to disobey God.
- Why couldn't God create us in such a way that we would never sin?
 - "God apparently thought it worth the risk of creating us as we are." (Paul Little)



Origin of evil

- "Forced love is rape; and God is not a divine rapist. He will not do anything to coerce their decision." (Norman Geisler)
- Free choice leaves the possibility of a wrong choice
 - "Evil is inherent in the risky gift of free will." (JB Phillips)
- "God's plan had the potential for evil when he bestowed on humans the freedom of choice, but the actual origin of evil came as a result of a man who directed his will away from God and towards his own selfish desires." (Ronald Rhodes)
- "But each one is tempted when he is drawn away by his own desires and enticed." (Jam. 1:14)
- "Whereas God created the fact of freedom, humans perform the acts of freedom. God made evil possible; creatures make it actual." (Norman Geisler)

What is god's ultimate purpose for allowing evil?

- "A theist does not have to claim that our present world is the best of all possible worlds, but it is the best way to the best possible world." (Norman Geisler)
- With the correct understanding of God, we both preserve freedom and defeat evil
- God is not finished yet

How to face a suffering world?

- Trust in His divine providence
- Ex: Joseph
 - "...you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, in order to bring it about as it is this day, to save many people alive." (Gen. 50:20)
 - "I have seen God take the broken pieces of my life and make it into something beautiful." (Nick Vujicic)
- Evaluate present sufferings in the light of eternity
 - "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us." (Rom. 8:18)
