HOW CAN WE SEE GOD AS A SAVIOR WHILE IN MY SIN?

I. See myself a sinner

- “...for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God...” (Rom. 3:23)
- “Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I did not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance.” (Mk. 2:17)
- “What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it?” (Rom. 6:1-2)

HOW CAN WE SEE GOD AS A SAVIOR WHILE IN MY SIN?

1. Trust in His love for you
 - “But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.” (Rom. 5:8)
2. Trust in His promise to forgive
3. Refer to the experience of others
4. Seeing Him as the Light of the world
