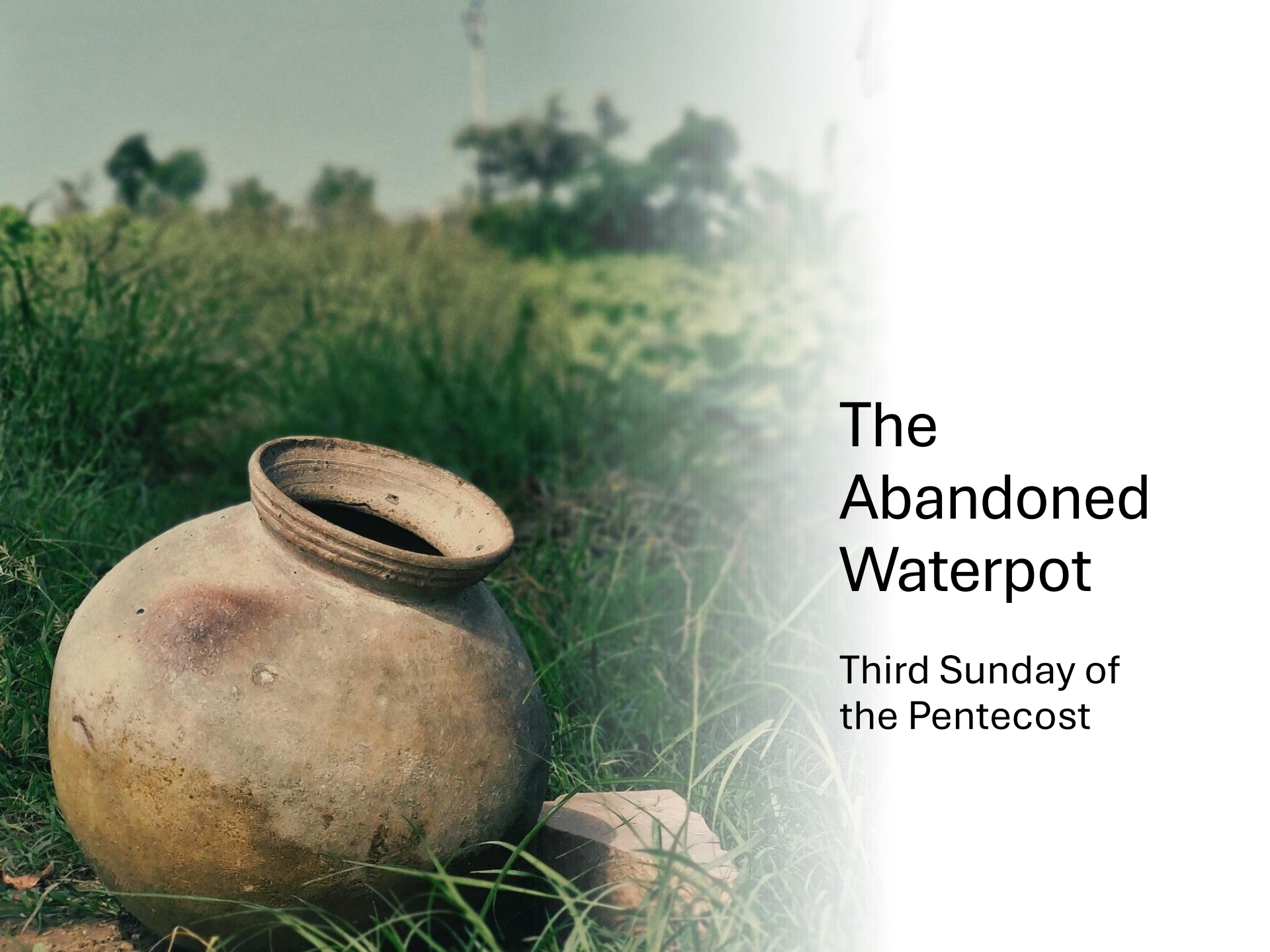

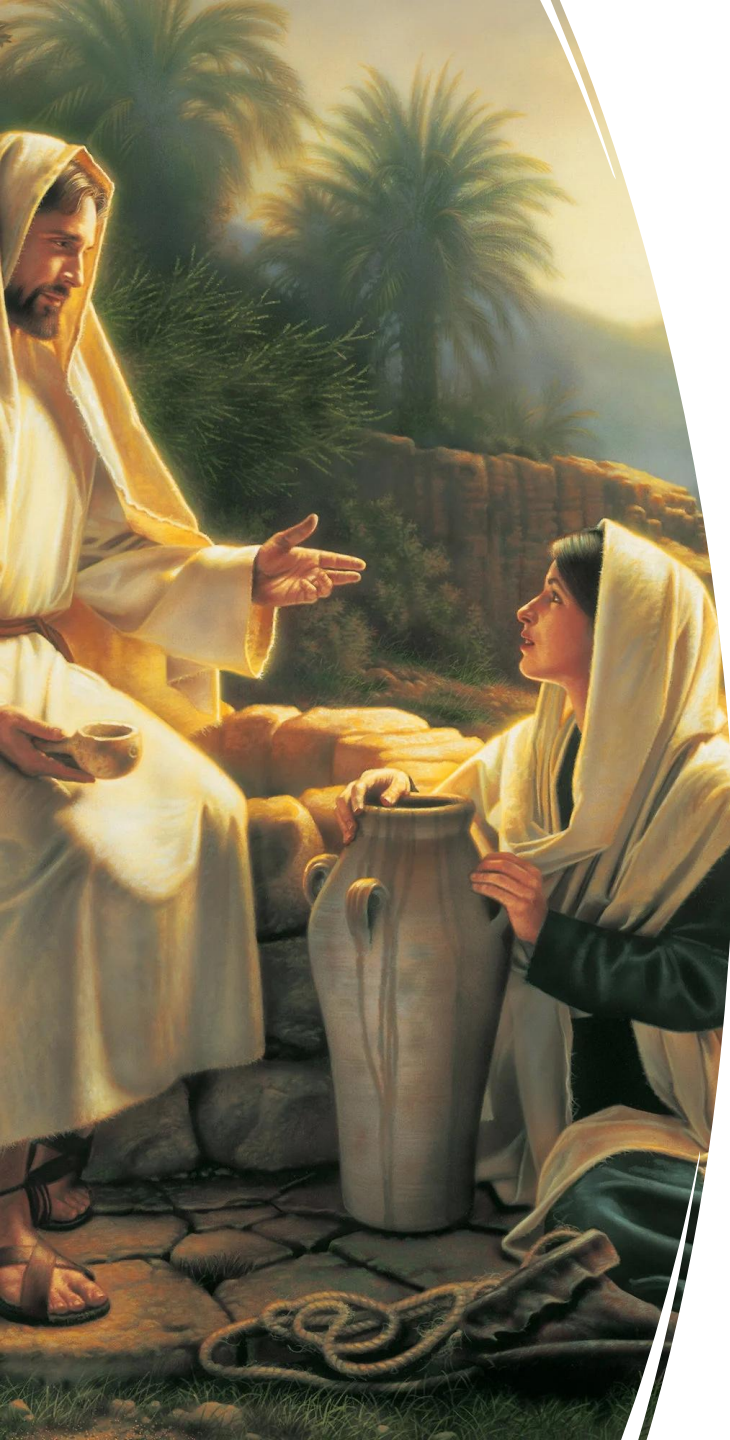
The Living Water

- “If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, “Give Me a drink,” **you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water.**”
(John 4:10)
- **What do we know about this living water?**
- It is clearly not physical
- Never thirst
- “The water that I shall give him will become in him **a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life.**”
(John 4:14)
- **Did the Samaritan Woman drink of this living water?**

The Jar of Your Past

- “Go, call your husband, and come here.” (John 4:16)
- “You have well said, “I have no husband,” for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband; in that you spoke truly.” (John 4:17–18)
- “Come, see a Man who told me all things that I ever did.” (John 4:29)
- EX: St. Paul





The Jar of Your Counterfeit Satisfactions

- “Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst.” (John 4:13–14)
- **The Lord does not offer a better jar**
- “The water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life.” (John 4:14)

The Jar of Your Self-Sufficiency

- “Sir, You have nothing to draw with, and the well is deep. Where then do You get that living water?” (John 4:11)
- Grace cannot be drawn, but only be received in humility
